

- French is spoken by more than 300 million people throughout the world.
- Working language of the European Union and an official language in 32 countries on 5 continents
- Foreign language learned by more than 50 million people
- French **is also the world's third most used business** language and the second-most heard and read language of international news.

■ World class education and innovation

- France benefits from a long tradition of scientific and technological research that accounts for the nation's strong performance in fields like space, transportation, electronics, chemistry, biotechnology, health, and mathematics.



■ Public Education

- Tuition costs in French universities and other public institutions are among the lowest in the world, as a large part of the cost of education is subsidized by the French government.



■ Travel opportunities

- Sharing borders with nine countries, France is an ideal spot from which to explore Europe. Overseas territories offer a rich diversity and landscape of France as well.



■ Research Excellence

- France is 2nd in the world in Fields medals (mathematics). It is 4th worldwide in Nobel prizes. With €53 billion in annual investment, France ranks fifth in the OECD for R&D spending.

HOW DOES HIGHER EDUCATION IN FRANCE WORK?

- Four main categories of higher education institutions in France:
 1. Public universities and research institutions
 2. Grandes écoles (which include France's prestigious schools of business and engineering)
 3. Schools of art and architecture
 4. Specialised schools.
- School year calendar – September to June
- The course fees start at around 200€ p.a., for public institutions. For grandes écoles, it is around 1000€ p.a.




- Campus France has created several catalogues that help guide students to find their perfect course of study in France.



FIND DEGREE PROGRAMS


Campus France lists programs taught in English for you.

- The catalog describes the cost, course content, admission requirements, nature and accreditation of the diploma offered, and the share of courses conducted in English. Over 1700 courses are listed. You can start your search by clicking on a map of France.
- 80% of the programs are at the master level. Offerings are especially numerous in the fields of business and management; engineering and technology; sciences, environment, and health; and law and economics.





- A Campus France catalog of short programs, both academic and cultural/linguistic
- This trilingual catalog (French, English, Spanish) contains classes in French as a foreign language, as well as short academic programs offered by the member institutions of the Campus France Forum. Many of the programs carry ECTS credits.
- Among the features of the catalog are:
 - An interactive map of France's regions
 - Searches by level of French proficiency or field of study
 - More than 650 athletic, cultural, and culinary opportunities

France has created the *Bienvenue en France* label to help international students.

All the above catalogs allow you to filter by this label to ensure the quality of your stay.

With the help of the label, which means “Welcome to France,” you can find institutions that offer the services you want:


- websites in several languages and including pages that speak to your needs;
- airport or train station pickups and help in meeting administrative requirements;
- housing assistance, from rooms in university housing to single or shared rentals to a room in the home of a local family;
- orientation events and seminars, guided tours, tourist visits;
- pairing with a peer already in France who can help you get acclimated, even before you leave home;
- study aids, courses in French as a foreign language, courses taught in English;
- help finding a job or an internship, contacts in the world of work;
- alumni networks to boost your international career.

HOW TO APPLY TO STUDY IN FRANCE?

- Undergraduate study (L1): apply for admission through the DAP to the French Embassy.
- Masters : Apply through MonMaster.
- Exchange : Apply through your university.
- All the information about specific applications is on Campus France Australia under « How to Apply ».



Application procedures vary depending on your nationality, level of studies or the type of higher education institution in which you wish to enrol.

EMBASSY SCHOLARSHIPS AND PROGRAMS FOR AUSTRALIANS

NICOLAS BAUDIN SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Embassy supports student mobility to France. The Nicolas Baudin Travel Grant sponsors students for the cost of a return flight ticket between Australia and France. There are 3 streams you can apply for:

- An exchange from Australia-France (2500\$ for travel)
- A full degree or Masters in France (2500\$ for travel)
- An internship organized by a French university for the Baudin program (5000\$ for travel and accommodation)



If you decide to study in France, this grant is for you! Apply to the French Embassy in April-June 2024.

FRANCE EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM



The Eiffel Scholarship Program is a highly prestigious award established by the French Ministry of Foreign Affairs to help French institutions of higher education attract top international students to their master's and doctoral programs. Its purpose is to train future foreign decision-makers in the private and public spheres in priority areas of study. Applications are accepted based on strong academic performance and merit.

Master level

- Eiffel scholarship recipients receive a monthly allowance of **€1,181** in addition to certain direct services, notably international airfare, domestic travel support, insurance, assistance in seeking housing, and cultural activities.

Doctoral level

- Eiffel scholarship recipients receive a monthly allowance of **€1,700** in addition to certain direct services, notably international airfare, domestic travel support, insurance, assistance in seeking housing, and cultural activities.


FRENCH + SCIENCES SUMMER SCHOOLS



- 3–4 week stays in June-July organized by French Learning Centers. Learn French in the morning, study science and do lab visits all afternoon.
- You do not need to speak French, and you gain many professional skills in the program.
- The Embassy offers a French+Sciences scholarship to pay for **students'** course fees and travel.
- Topics offered:
 - Focus on Sustainable Development (*Montpellier*)
 - Science and Technology of the Sea (*Brest*)
 - Micro, nano and smart tech for Industrial Applications (*Besançon*)
 - Focus on Transportation and Energy (*Rouen*)
 - French + Gastronomy (*Rouen*)
 - Mountain Sciences (*Chambéry*)

LANGUAGE TEACHING ASSISTANT PROGRAM

- This international youth mobility program is designed to give university students the opportunity to discover a new region and culture by working alongside an English teacher in a French school environment.
- Assistants live in France for 6 months, with a monthly salary of 1010€.
- They can teach in primary or secondary schools and share their culture and language skills.
- Participants gain work experience and professionalism, bringing undeniable added value to their career.
- These programs are open to students of all disciplines who can demonstrate a competence in French, and who are seeking to increase their linguistic and cultural proficiency.




HEADING TO FRANCE

FAQS



- Do I have to be proficient in French to study in France?
 - No, to study a course taught in English or learn French you do not have to be fluent. All university courses taught in French require a B2 level of French (2 years of study).
- Can I work while studying in France?
 - Yes, up to a maximum amount of hours depending on the length of your studies. (482 hours every 6 months)
- Do I need a visa to study in France?
 - Yes, if you are in France for longer than 3 months you will need a visa. Apply on France Visas, and find more information about visas.
- Can I travel while I study?
 - Yes, with a visa in France you have access to 26 countries in the Schengen Zone and you can take full advantage of cheaper travel. After your study is over, you have 3 months in the Zone to travel without a visa. It is not recommended to travel before your program because of administrative procedures.
