French is spoken by more than 300 million people in the world and is the official language of 32 countries across 5 continents. French. alongside English and German, is a working language of the European Union. 

Working while studying



The law allows foreign students to work in France up

to 964 hours per year, equivalent to 60% of the full work week in France.

Working while studying is helpful to cover some expenses but cannot cover the full cost of living, so plan ahead with your savings.

Several online resources facilitate job hunting for students:

- <u>Jobaviz</u>: a job offers platform managed by the CROUS that helps students find a job matching their profile.
- <u>CIDJ</u>: The Centre d'Information et de Documentation Jeuness" publishes job offers for students on its website.
- France Alumni: Members of the France Alumni network have access to many job offers from companies looking for multicultural profiles. Users can use an interactive search engine to seamlessly find a job and/or an internship.

Internships

You can apply for an internship while studying in France. Work experience in a company, university or lab is legally required to be remunerated at a fixed rate (around 600€ per month) and can complement your studies.

Cultural Offer

Discounts at museums, theatres and cinemas + free access to libraries.



Transport

Transport companies offer preferential fares to students.



Meals

Access to 450 university restaurants in France: €3.30 per meal (starter-main course-dessert) + offers in certain restaurants.



Shopping

Many shops offer special deals for students. Simply present your student card when making a purchase.

How to apply to study in France?

Discover your options

The procedure to follow to apply for a degree or course in France depends on several factors:

- Nationality
- Country of residence
- The High School Diploma held by the candidate
- The level of study you want to enrol into
- The type of studies (Fine Arts and Architecture students can apply via CampusArt)

The different procedures are listed below:

- <u>Undergraduate study</u> (L1): apply for admission through the **Demande d'Admission** Préalable (DAP) to the French Embassy, or Parcoursup if you are a French national.
- Masters': Apply through MonMaster.
- <u>Doctorate:</u> Apply directly to **doctoral department** of the university in France.
- Exchange or study abroad: Apply through your Australian university.

FIND YOUR FUNDING

CAMPUSBOURSES, a search engine available in French and English, simplifies your search for financial aid.

EMBASSY SCHOLARSHIPS AND PROGRAMS FOR AUSTRALIANS

NICOLAS BAUDIN SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Embassy supports student mobility to France. The Nicolas Baudin Travel Grant sponsors students for the cost of a return flight ticket between Australia and France. There are 2 streams you can apply for:



- An exchange from Australia-France (2500\$ for travel)
- A full degree or Masters in France (2500\$ for travel)

Eiffel Excellence Scholarship Program



Developed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Eiffel Excellence Scholarship Program provides a pathway for future foreign decision-makers in the public and private sectors in degree programs at the Master's and Doctoral levels.

French +Program Scholarship

Developed by Campus France, in partnership with a selection of French Language Centers (FLE), French+ is a short-term language and scientific study program. It is designed for international university students in scientific and technical fields, and English speakers who may be complete beginners in French. The French+Sciences Program offers 3- to 4-week stays completely organised by language centres in France. Each session focuses on a specific scientific topic.
